Topics	Details
Current events of National & International importance	Includes recent happenings and significant developments at national and global levels.
History of India & Indian National Movement	Covers ancient, medieval, and modern Indian history, with emphasis on the freedom struggle.
Indian & World Geography	Physical, Social, and Economic Geography of India and the World.
Indian Polity & Governance	Constitution, Political System, Panchayati Raj, Public Policy, Rights Issues, etc.
Economic & Social Development	Topics such as Sustainable Development, Poverty, Inclusion, Demographics, and Social Sector Initiatives.

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UPSC Syllabus for General Studies Paper-II

It comprises 80 questions from the following topics carrying a maximum of 200 marks to be solved in 2 hours.

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UPSC MAINS EXAM

The Main Examination is conducted over 5 to 7 days. Each paper lasts for 3 hours. The Main Examination is descriptive, testing aspirants' knowledge of current affairs and ethical aptitude.

- General Studies Papers (II to V): These papers cover a wide range of subjects, including governance, social issues, and technology.
- Optional Papers (VI & VII): These are specialized papers based on subjects chosen by the candidate.



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UPSC Mains Syllabus General Studies Paper 1

The UPSC Mains General Studies Paper 1 covers a wide range of topics, including Indian Heritage and Culture, History, and the Geography of the World and Society. This paper is designed to assess a candidate's understanding of historical contexts, cultural developments, and geographical knowledge, all of which are essential for thorough preparation for civil services. UPSC Mains GS Paper 1 includes the following:

Topic	Details
Indian Culture	Salient aspects of Art Forms, Literature, and Architecture from ancient to modern times.
Modern Indian History	Significant events, issues, and personalities from the mid-eighteenth century (1750s) to the present. Different stages of 'The Freedom Struggle' and important contributors from various regions of the country. Post-independence consolidation and reorganization within India.
History of the World	Events, forms, and effects on society since the 18th century (World Wars, Industrial Revolution, Colonization, etc.). Political philosophies like Communism, Capitalism, Socialism, etc.

UPSC MAINS GENERAL STUDIES PAPER-II

The UPSC Mains General Studies Paper 2 focuses on Governance, the Constitution, Polity, Social Justice, and International Relations. This paper evaluates a candidate's understanding of India's political and administrative framework, as well as their comprehension of key issues affecting governance and international affairs. The UPSC Mains GS Paper 2 includes:

Indian Constitution	Historical underpinnings, evolution, and features. Amendments and significant provisions. Basic structure doctrine.
Comparison with Other Countries	Comparative analysis of the Indian Constitution with that of other countries.

The UPSC Mains General Studies Paper 3 focuses on Technology, Economic Development, Biodiversity, Environment, Security, and Disaster Management. This paper assesses a candidate's understanding of contemporary issues related to economic growth, technological advancements, environmental challenges, and security concerns. It emphasizes practical knowledge and problem-solving skills. The topics included in UPSC Mains GS Paper 3 are:

Economy	Issues related to planning, mobilization of resources, growth, development, and employment. Government budgeting and associated policies. Inclusive growth and associated challenges. Effects of liberalization (post-1991 reforms), changes in industrial policy, and their impact on industrial growth. Infrastructure (Energy, Ports, Roads, Airports, Railways) and investment models like Public-Private Partnerships (PPP).
Agriculture	Major cropping patterns, irrigation systems, and storage. Transport and marketing of agricultural produce, constraints, and e-technology for farmers. Economics of animal rearing and food processing industries (scope, significance, supply chain management). Farm subsidies, MSP issues, Public Distribution System (objectives, functioning, limitations, revamping), and food security. Land reforms in India.
