responsible citizens be the silent spectators and commentators. There are several ways we can contribute to such best practices, no matter how

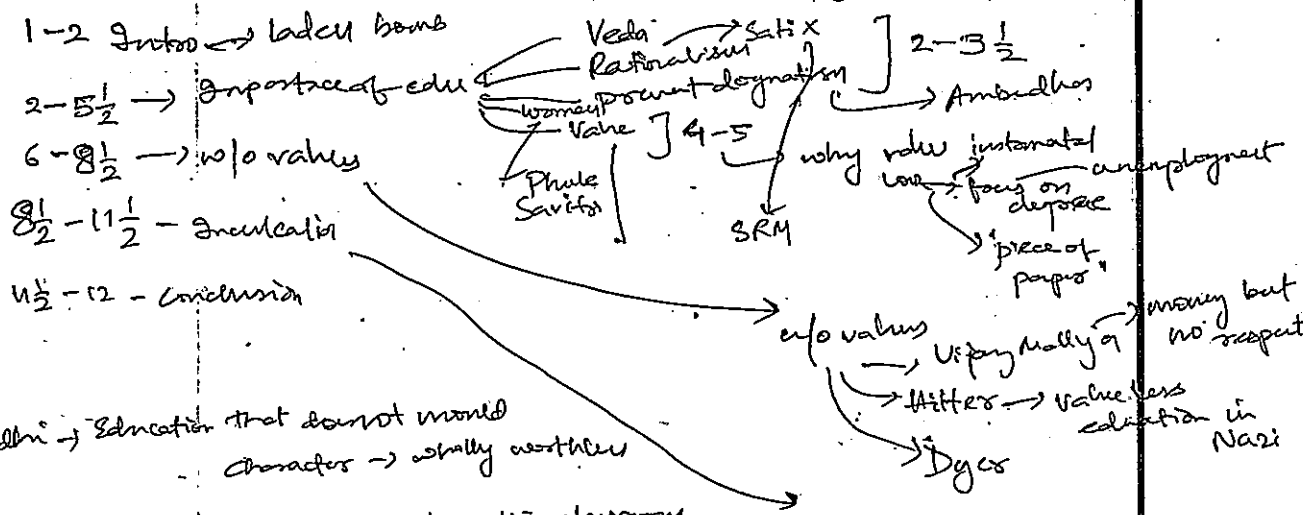
