1. Discuss how did Lachit Borphukan succeed in defeating the mighty Mughals under Ram Singha in the 17th century? [10]

Udayaditya Singha after succeeding the throne made Lachit Deka, Bor Borphukan of lower Assam. Ahom captured Guwahati from Koch and the ~~to~~ Ahom-Mughal conflict start again.

Mughals under Ram Singha ~~in~~ started invasion of Assam. But Ahoms fought bravely. ~~to~~ Initially Ahoms faced defeat in battle of Alaboi in 1669, and ten thousand soldiers were killed in the battle. Later in battle of Saraighat (1671) Ahom defeated the Mughals. Mughals mainly defeated due to the efficient commandership of Lachit Borphukan.

Lachit Borphukan - an efficient commander

→ Lachit knew that it is impossible to defeat the mighty Mughals in land

battle. Therefore he forced Mughal to take the river route.

→ He created obstruction in land route and made forth in riverside.

→ It is said that he killed his maternal uncle as he was delaying in forth making.

→ He also used guerrilla warfare on the Mughals.

→ On the day of battle Lachit was seriously ill and could not go to the battle ground. But after seeing his soldiers retreating he went to the battle field and fought bravely. Seeing his on the battle ground his soldiers get motivated and he defeated the Mughals.

Lachit Borphukan's name will always remembered as a symbol of bravery, courage and leadership. For his ~~hon~~ To honour his the best passing cadete of NDA is awarded with Lachit Borphukan award.

2. Give a brief account of Koch architecture in the medieval period.

In the medieval period the Koch under Narayanarayan were the most powerful of the region. However in ~~architect~~ the field of architecture there are less ~~on~~ information available.

Kamakhya architecture

- After destruction of Kamakhya temple by Kalapahar it was Narayanarayan who ~~construct~~ the rebuilt the temple in 1665.
- It is said that he hired people outside Assam to construct the temple.
- The temple is more similar to North Indian architecture.

Haigrib Madhab Mandir

- The temple is said to built during Raghudev Narayan of Koch kingdom.
- The architecture @ resemblance the north Indian style of architecture.
- The continuous elephant row is similar to that of Ajanta cave.

However, ~~it is~~ historian expects more @ architecture from Koch Kingdom perhaps the structures were destroyed by ~~invaders~~ invaders or they were made of perishable material.

To spread Christianity the Baptist missionaries entered into Assam in 19th century. They started spreading Christianity in Assamese language. It was in year 1836 to 1872 when Bengali language was imposed to ~~peop~~ Assam as official language. The Baptist Missionaries protest against this.

Contribution of Baptist Missionary

- In 1833 the first printed book was published by the missionaries which was the translation of Bible named as Dharmapustak.
- The first Assamese dictionary was also published by the ~~at~~ missionaries under Niles Bronson and Nithiram Farwel (first Assamese to

convert into Christian).

→ When Bengali was imposed in Assam it was the missionaries who protest against it. ~~and~~

~~with Baptist m.~~ ⑥

→ By the collective effort of Baptist missionary and Assam's middle class intelligencia in the year 1872

Assamese language was ~~also~~ recognised as Assam. official language.

Main features

"Live and Let live" - Upendranath Brahma

- Upendranath Brahma was a Indian Bodo social reformist, ~~he~~
- He was born in Kokrajhar district of Assam.
- He was former president of Assam Bodo Student Union (8th president)

Contribution of Brahma

- He placed a 92 point demand for upliftment of Bodo community.

Key demands

- He demanded for immediate declaration of Bodo as associate language in Kokrajhar, ^{dist.} and Udalguri subdivision.
- He demanded to make Bodo language a ~~an~~ optional paper in all exams conducted by APSE/OPSE.

He worked as a guardian of Bodo people, therefore ~~is~~ he is considered as "Bodoba".

His birth anniversary is celebrated as Bodoba Divas, ~~on~~ 1st march May.

The Bodo autonomous council was another demand made by him. and Assam government already made Bodo autonomous council. But he was not alive to witness this. On 1994, 31 march ~~was~~ he expired.

Recently Assam chief minister Himanta Biswa Sharma announced 31 march as Chakra Divas in honour of him.

8. Discuss the scope of organic agriculture in the North East with reference to Assam. [10]

North East India is geographically a rich region and the soil is rich in minerals. Therefore we see organic agriculture in this region.

"Assam - organic in agriculture by default"

1. Poverty: People of NE India as well as Assam economically not so efficient that can go for high technology and ~~can~~ inorganic agriculture.
2. Lack in technology: As compared to people of other region of India Assam lacks in technological development which forced them to stick to organic farming.
3. Fertile land: ~~The~~ Assam's soil is predominantly alluvial, which is good for agriculture.
4. Poor implementations of govt. scheme: The schemes that avail high yield

variety of crops in ~~is~~ not properly implemented in this region.

5. Lack of irrigation facilities

Benefits for being organic

- No chemical used therefore low risk of health.
- Less capital intensive.

Demerit

- Low economic growth
- ~~is~~ High risk of damage.

2. Wastage of asset.

- Most of them are undated yet some are dated in Gupta era and Saka era.

Epigraphs of different dynasty

Varman dynasty

1. Bodhganga epigraph of Bhutivarman is the earliest dated inscription.
2. Dubi & Nidhampur grants and three seals of Nalanda are the evidence of glorious reign of Ghaskar Varman.

Sabastambha dynasty

1. Nyuntal copper plate of Harjara varman.
2. Parbatiya inscription of Varanala varman -deva

Pala dynasty

1. Borgaon epigraph of Ratrapal
2. Guchhal epigraph of Ropal
3. Guwahati and suwalkuchi epigraph of Indrapala.

Epigraphs from other regions

1. Allahbad pillar prasasti of Samudra-gupta written by Harisena give evidence of Kamrupa and Devaka kingdom of Assam
2. Pashupati epigraph of Dantidurga Jayaditya II says about the ~~conflict~~ marriage alliance with Lichavis.
3. Mandazar epigraph talks about the conflict of Sudhitavarman

with Yasovarman.

4. Samangad epigraph of Dantidurga give evidence ~~with~~ of the conflict with western Chalukya.

5. Kanai Barakhi Rock inscription give an account of the invasion of Bakhtiyar Khilji.

All these epigraph juxtaposed with other epigraphs and literary sources gives detailed of Ancient Assam.

12. When it comes to courage and sacrifice, women of the Ahom nobility were no less than their male counterparts. Elucidate with reference to sacrifice of Mula Gabhoru and Joymoti Konwari. [15]

In the 600 years of reign of Ahoms there were several ups and downs in the history. The reign of efficient rulers like Pratap Singha, Rudra Singha and officers like Borpuhakam & Lachit Borpuhakam always glorified history. At the same time we also hear about the courage and sacrifices of Ahom ~~to~~ Queens and other women. Mula Gabhoru and Joymoti Konwari are among them.

Mula Gabhoru

→ She was wife of Ahom officer Phrasengmung.

→ In the fight against Turbak Khan her husband died.

→ The Ahom soldiers were became

- weak and started retreating.
- Mula Gaboru on the other hand showed her courage and fight bravely.
 - Seeing her the Ahom soldier get motivated and chased the Mughal army to beyond Sankosh River.
 - However Mula Gaboru died in the battle.

Joymati Konwari

- She was wife of King Godadhari Singha (Godapani)
- Lalok Khola under King Sulikoba started executing the potential King of Ahoms.
- After killing hundreds of prince they search for Godapani. However Godapani fled to Nagapahar.
- They asked Joymati about her husband but she did not say a word about her husband.

- The soldier took her to the Jerunga Pothar and start torturing her.
- She was bitten with lader, poured hot water but she was determined to not say in order to protect her Husband as well as the people from the king.
- After two day she died in the same field.
- Later Godapami came with force and execute the Lota Raja.

The bravery and courage showed by the two lady will always ~~remain~~ be in the top of list. To commemorate their sacrifices every year ~~29 April~~^{May} is celebrate as Meela Gadhoni Dives and 21 March as Jaymati Dives

13. Discuss the contribution of Momai Tamuli Barbarua in reconstructing Assamese village life on a sound and secure economic footing. [15]

Momai Tamuli Barbarua is said to be the reformer of economic condition of mediaeval period of Assam.

He was Barbarua under King Atatap Singha. Momai Tamuli was a ~~learned~~ wise person therefore the king gave him the responsibility to reconstruct the economy of his Kingdom.

Paik System

- On recommendation of Momai Tamuli Barbarua the paik system was imposed.
- Any ~~so~~ male member of the family between the age 15-65 is called paik.
- they form a got of 4 people paik (later 3) who will serve the state in lieu of 2 pura land known as gamati.

→ 1 paik from a got will serve for 3 months (later 4) and others will look after his land.

→ Paikas were divided into different khels.

• Benefit of paik system

- Need not to keep standing army.
- All the people were well engaged in economic activities.

He also introduced another system known as Posa System

→ Posa system is a tribal exismment policy.

→ The tribal chiefs of hills areas keep on raiding the Ahom Kingdom.

- Therefore Noma Tamuli made this system where they offer lands known as khads to the tribal chief where they can cultivate and take the products.
- They are also allotted some paiks known as Bahalya paiks.
- These system ~~was~~ reduced the raid of hill tribals to the Ahom Kingdom.

Noma Tamuli for his wide knowledge and well implementation of these two policy considered to be a efficient officer of Ahom nobility. He also made waving compulsory so womens. &

Hence we can say that Noma Tamuli is a efficient economic reformer of that period.

14. Critically discuss the inner line regulation introduced by the British in Assam in 1873. [15]

Assam from the starting of 19th century facing the problem of immigrants.

It was in the ~~10~~ year 1873 when British introduced the inner line regulation.

Features

→ The British to preserve the tribal identity ~~had~~ introduced the system. Where they demarcated the line from where the other people can not entered into the hill areas.

→ However the tribals from the hill areas were allowed to come to the plain areas and also allowed to settled there.

→ The tribals were free to trade
in the plain area.
