Bhagat Singh one of the youngest revolutionary hanged for involved in Lahore conspiracy and for murder of British officer Saunders at just the tender age of 23. He knew about the consequences for his action but without even fearing death he risked it all for the nation and his sacrifice brought a new wave of energy amongst the youth of the nation with the slogan 'Inquilab Zindabad' and his sacrifices are still remembered when one talks about true 'patriotism'.

Examples could also be picked from the golden pages of 'Axomia Burañji'.

The Ahom General Lachit Barphukan during the Mughal attack and the Battle of 1671 saraighat in 1671 against Ram Singh showed the might of Ahom military and Navy prowess under his command. He was very sick from the excessive mental and physical strain from the prolonged war in spite of his poor health he came forward risking his own health for the protection of Ahom kingdom and his cheering motivated the soldiers and led

to show victory. His risk and death sacrifices linkpinned the thoms as the greatest kingdoms which could not be defeated by Mughals.

Similar examples could also be picked from the contemporary times across people from all fields of Q who have etched their names in golden letters.

Chetan Bhagat who became a household name and a millionaire took the risk of giving up on his well paying banking career to become a writer and gave us some of the bestselling novels of all time with over millions of copies made.

Even '3 idiots' the blockbuster

movie was based on a book written by Chetan Bhagat 'Five Point Someone'

Further, example could be taken of Bill Gates, who was a college dropout to build the Giant 'Microsoft', he did not have everything handed out to him on a silver platter but he took the risk of giving himself a chance and it proved to be in his favour.

Birubala Rabha of Assam, on whose determination and continuous effort put an end to ~~with~~ witch hunting in Assam and won her the prestigious 'Padma Shri' is one of

the pioneering examples, her efforts at educating the villagers about the ill of witch hunting was not well accepted by the society, she faced ostracization and humiliation but she risked her dignity and her continuous effort bore fruits. From the field of cinema, an example could be picked of Jitendra Kumar who passed from IIT Kharagpur and was settled with a well-paying job, however for his passion towards acting he gave up his job and the rest is well known. His iconic

role as 'Teetu Bhaiya' in Kota  
Factory and 'Abhishek' in Panchayat  
series became one of the most  
loved series of all time, which  
earned him both name and fame.

From the field of digital  
space, with billions of active  
users on youtube, a name that  
deserves a mention is Mr. Nischay  
Malhan, popularly known as  
'Triggered Insaan'. Bullied since a  
young age for his 'feminine' looks, the  
nerd who passed from 1117 took  
a job in a well paying corporate job  
but soon realised his passion for  
online gaming and left his job only  
to become one of the richest youtubers  
with around 25 million subscribers

and receiving praise and awards from PM Modi himself for his contribution towards <sup>orange</sup> digital economy.

India with majority of young population is relatively a 'young nation' full of energy and untapped talents which if channelized to its potential can definitely bring positive outcomes for the nation, where population is generally considered to be a bane than a boon.

Northeast India, and hub of  
economic affairs under Kamrup (M)  
district has been facing the issue of  
flash flood.

The phenomenon of flash flood  
refers to sudden local flood in a  
short period of time due to heavy  
rain.

Even with the slightest rainfall  
during the month of June - September

the city grapples with the issue of flash flood which brings the city life to a standstill, causing damage to economy and infrastructure.

The main cause behind the flash flood could be attributed to improper urban planning. People from around the other districts of Assam as well as the NE states come and settle in Guwahati dreaming about a 'city life' with best schools, colleges, job opportunities, healthcare facilities etc. This has however led to the problem of urban sprawl.

Rampant constructions are going on around the city

as flat culture is blooming to accomodate the people however without much importance being given to constructing drainage and waste disposal method or cleaning up of rivers like Bharalu which has been reduced to a drain with foul smelling water where garbages are disposed off.

Not to forget mentioning of cutting of hill ~~area~~ around. Eg:- VSTM college construction on Gumahati-Meghalaya border has allegedly caused flash flood in the region.

The wetlands of Assam especially around Gumrahati city such as Deepor Beel and

Silsako which could act as reservoir of flash flood water have been encroached upon to meet the growing population has become yet another reason for flash flood.

The ongoing development vs environment debate where lot of trees are being cut down to accommodate Noonmati - Dighlapukhuri flyover. The trees with their roots are important in soaking <sup>holding off</sup> the water.

The improper waste disposal by the Guwahati Municipal Corporation has led to the problem of clogging of drains which does

not give passage for the water to pass.

The Assam Government has taken several steps to deal with the issue of flash flood.

The Government has invested in construction of flyovers to give alternate route to use when low lying areas are flooded. Eg:-  
 The Bhagadutta Bridge <sup>flyover</sup> constructed at Rukmini Gaon, the Zoo road flyover, Noonmati - Dighalipukhuri flyover covers the major flood hotspots of the city.

Government nudge policies like 'Ek per maa ke naam

has helped in the afforestation drive which if taken proper care of could ~~do~~ to an extent compensate for the tree cover loss because of construction projects and also helpful in holding and soaking in of flood water.

Amrit Sarovar Project under which the Government is constructing ponds around the city in the temple, school etc premises is also to be considered an importa step in holding of flood water.

Recently the Assam Government has also decided to work in the direction of suggestion

provided by a Netherlands based study which suggested for taking up scientific approach in dealing with the waterlogging.

Installation of silt traps has been suggested as a way.

Deployment of eco-blocks like barricades in the flood prone zones of Anil Nagar, Nabin Nagar, Chandmani would provide temporary relief.

The Flood Hazard Atlas recently launched for the past 26 years would provide comprehensive data on the areas under greater flood risk.

and would help make plans accordingly.

The ASSAMSAT would prove monumental in tracking in flood areas and also providing accurate warning against flood issue.

Every year the Government provides lakhs to the flood victims and the city limps back to normalcy. However, a prolonged scientific strategy needs to be adopted to deal with this urban flooding problem on scientific line for long term.

With heavy investments announced during the Advantage Assam 2.0, the Government of Assam needs to buckle up to sustain the industrial developments.

Frequent flash floods would have damaging effects on the economy.

The migrant workers who come to the city looking for jobs engaging in casual work contributes towards the city's economy. However, the frequent flash flood and them facing losses as business stops during flood such as delivery jobs, food stalls etc.

The migrant workers thus do not consider settling permanently in the city leading to loss for Assam!

The Government of Assam can take up inspiration from foreign countries such as China and incorporate the sponge city concept to deal with flood.

Japanese Method of 'Miyawaki forest' technique could also be adopted to encourage urban forestry. This has already been incorporated in Mumbai.

The traditional embankment system around Brahmaputra has proved to be an undated.

technology.

Methods like dredging,  
using of geo bags, siltation method  
needs to be adopted.

Thus, Guwahati has already  
taken up significant measures to  
deal with urban flash flood  
however it's not sufficient enough.  
More scientific methods needs to  
be incorporated. Opinions of  
experts from around the world  
needs to be considered.
